







Las Vegas High School Featured in Day-long Multiplatform Event Celebrating "Stories of Champions" — Individuals and Organizations Committed to Improving Outcomes for Youth and Raising Graduation Rates

Wes Moore to Host "American Graduate Day 2014"

Live from Tisch WNET Studios at Lincoln Center in NYC, airing September 27 on Vegas PBS

American Graduate Day 2014 returns this fall for its third consecutive year. Wes Moore, best-selling author and U.S. Army veteran, will host the all-day broadcast that premieres Saturday, September 27 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Vegas PBS. The local station was chosen as one of four PBS stations across the country to provide a live, national, seven-minute remote focusing on a specific area related to high school dropout prevention. Hosted by local news anchor Olivia Fierro, the Vegas PBS segment will feature Dave Wilson, former principal of Chaparral High School who was instrumental in the high school's turnaround success; Jennifer Lopardo, Communities in Schools of Nevada on-site coordinator; and Jessica Sanchez, a Chaparral High School student. Vegas PBS' live remote will be featured between 2 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. in a section focusing on "Career Readiness and College Completion."

Broadcast and streamed live from the Tisch WNET Studios at Lincoln Center in New York City, the annual multiplatform event is part of the public media initiative, American Graduate: Let's Make It Happen. This program, provided by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, is intended to help communities bolster graduation rates through the power and reach of local public media stations. Featuring seven hours of national and local programming, live interviews and performances, American Graduate Day 2014 will recognize the exceptional work of individuals and groups across the country that have been designated as "American Graduate Champions." The Champions will be honored for helping local youth to stay on track for college and career successes.

"Vegas PBS is proud to have been selected to showcase to the country the turnaround success story at Chaparral High School and the role of Communities In Schools of Nevada in helping students reach graduation," said Vegas PBS General Manager Tom Axtell. "In Nevada, which has one of the highest dropout rates in the nation, we are given the opportunity to spotlight a positive story on our road to recovery and to show the organizations, schools, teachers and administrators who are working every day to turn this crisis around."

"We are thrilled to be working with American Graduate Day and PBS on a television event that highlights our mission of keeping students in school and on a successful course for the future," said Diane Fearon, CEO of Communities In Schools of Nevada. "We are excited to share one of our local success stories in hopes it inspires everyone to become a part of changing the picture of education."

Hosted by Wes Moore, a bestselling author, TV personality (PBS/"Coming Back with Wes Moore" and OWN/"Beyond Belief") and champion for youth, *American Graduate Day 2014* has been designed with the aims of inspiring citizens to connect with their local public media station and local community organizations and encouraging them to get involved as American Graduate Champions to bolster graduation rates. Throughout the day, on-air personalities from PBS, WNET, and other media organizations will join Moore in studio for special segments.

This year's topics are scheduled to include Early Education, Caring Consistent Adults, More and Better Learning, Special Needs Communities, STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art/Design and Math) Programs, Dropout Prevention and Re-Engagement and College and Career Readiness.
