Tami Hance-Lehr, State Director & CEO

Tami believes in the beauty of the world and the endless possibilities one can achieve through determination, positivity and catapulting over one goal, to race to the next. All done with the belief that doing "whatever it takes" doesn't mean sacrifice, but exhibiting strength and smarts to master any challenges.

Exuberant and driven, Hance-Lehr played a leading role as a shareholder and senior vice president at Destinations by Design (DBD), for 26 years. Destinations by Design is the largest DMC and special event company in Las Vegas and is an innovator in creative, event management. In April, 2017 Hance-Lehr took a leap of faith and left DBD in pursuit of a purpose driven life. Shortly after, she joined the CIS of Nevada team as Resource Development Director. In this role she expanded our donor base and partnership effort across the state while strengthening relationships with long time donors. After a year in the Resource Development position, Tami was awarded the promotion to State Director and CEO of CIS of Nevada.

Being a leader represents a significant part of how she lives her life. Since moving to Las Vegas in 1984, Hance-Lehr has been passionate about her community. At the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV), she aligned herself early on with empowering women, serving as president of the Theta ETA chapter of Sigma Kappa in 1991. Graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree, with an emphasis in Communication Studies, Hance-Lehr leveraged her love of Las Vegas and ventured into a career in the hospitality industry.

In 2014 Hance-Lehr served as the president of the Las Vegas Hospitality Assocation (LVHA), the largest hospitality organization in Southern Nevada. She also served on the Meeting Planners International (MPI) Foundation U.S. Council for two years; 2014-2016. Giving back continues to be a priority, Hance-Lehr is a past president (2015-2017) of Nevada Women's Philanthropy (NWP), a member driven, large impact grant making organization. Since its inception in 2005, NWP has granted over \$4 million dollars to Southern Nevada area non-profits. She also currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Nevada Community Foundation. In 2016 Hance-Lehr was awarded a Leadership Badge from the Girl Scouts of Southern Nevada.
