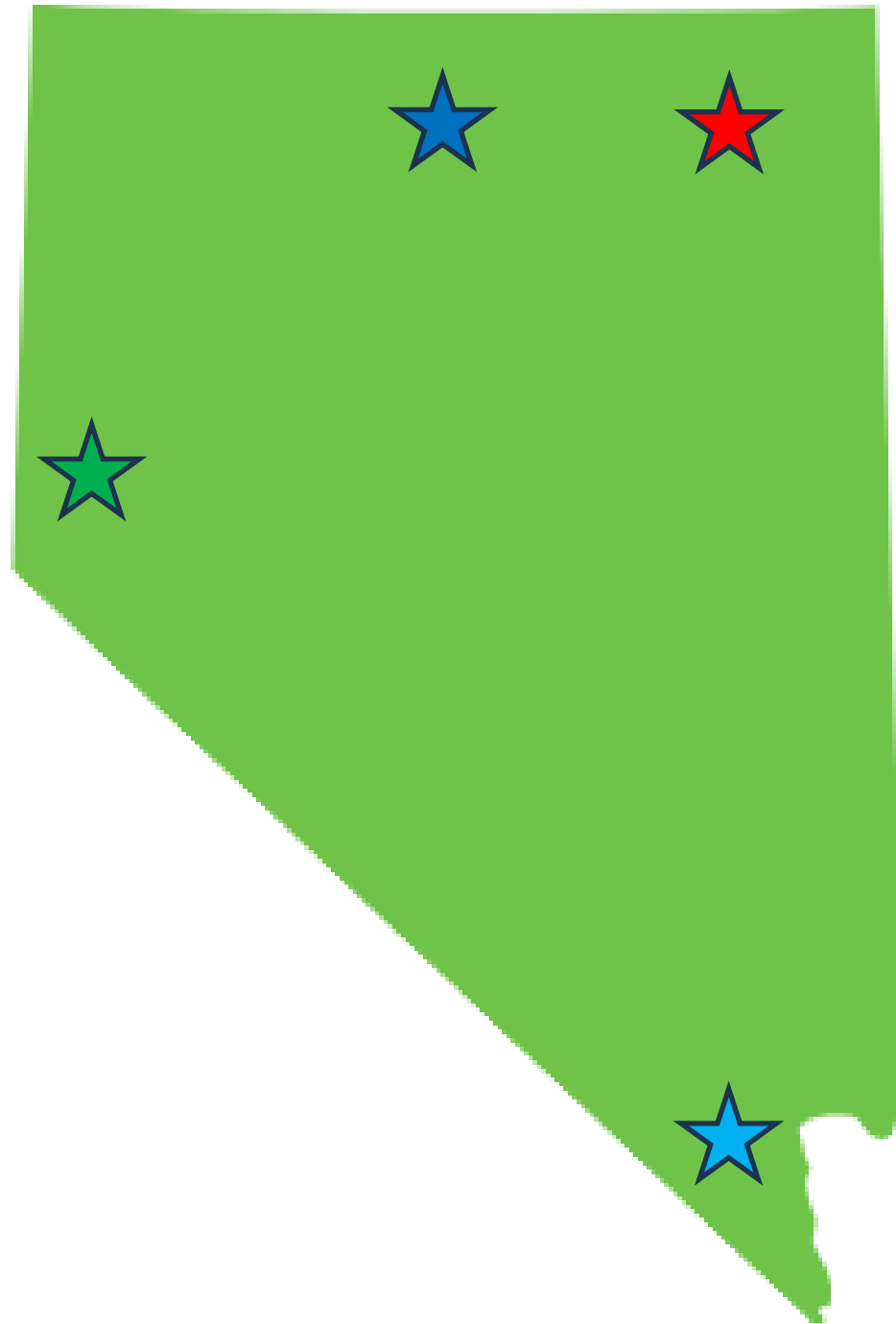

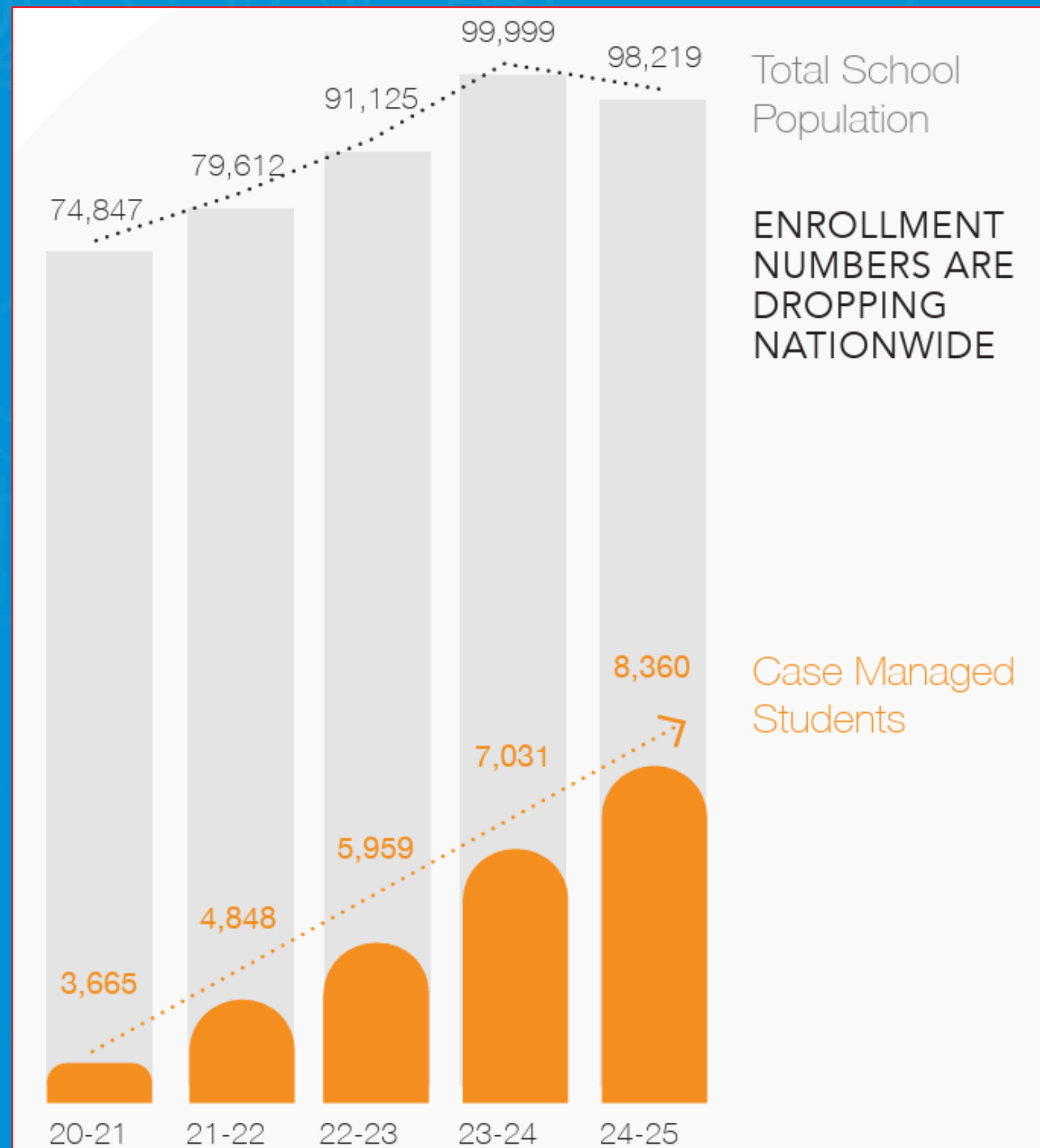

Trend Analysis

➤ School enrollment numbers are declining both nationwide and in the State of Nevada.

Nationwide:

- Public school enrollment is projected to decrease by 5.5% by 2031.
- Some reasons may be shrinking school budgets, falling birthrate, and the growing school choice movement.

Nevada:

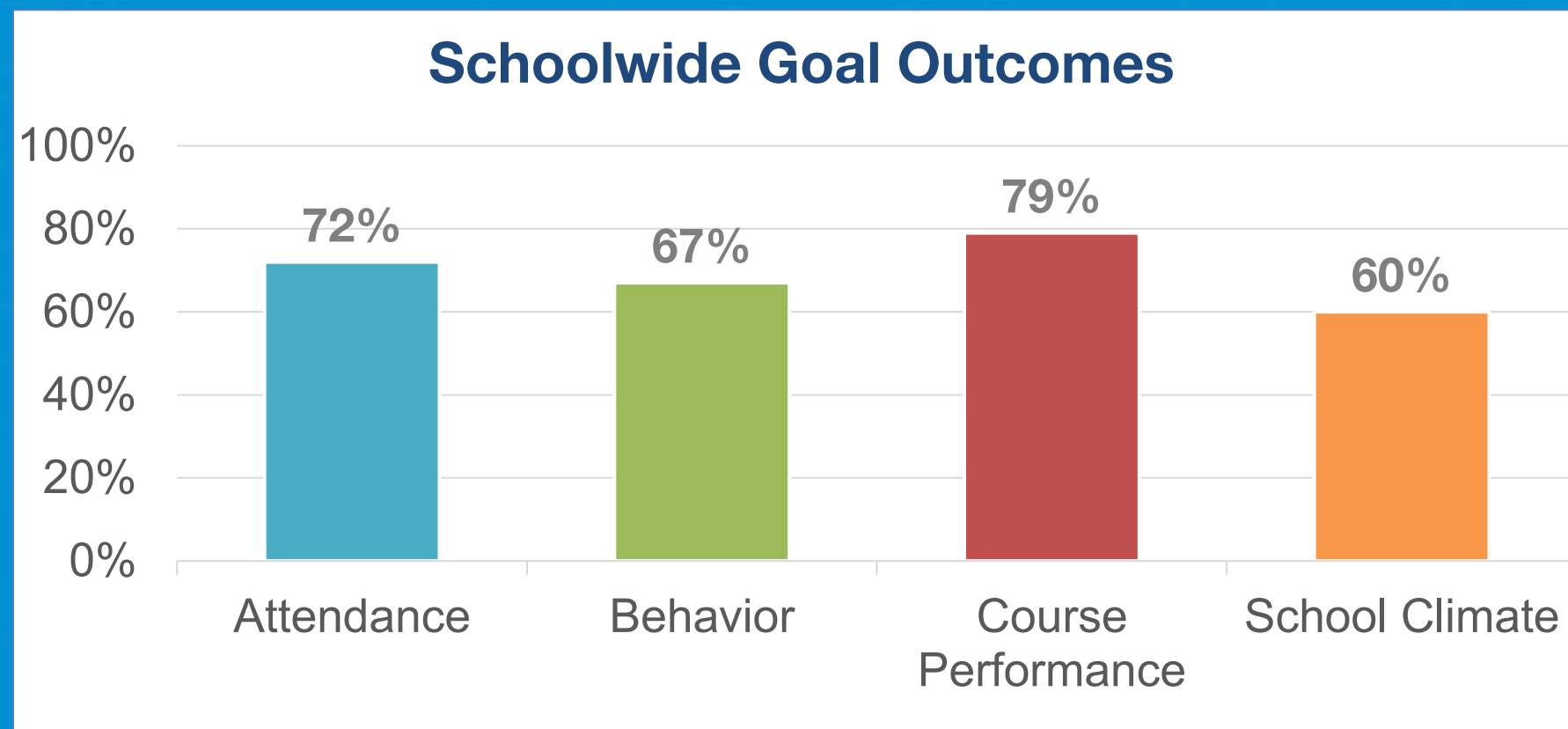
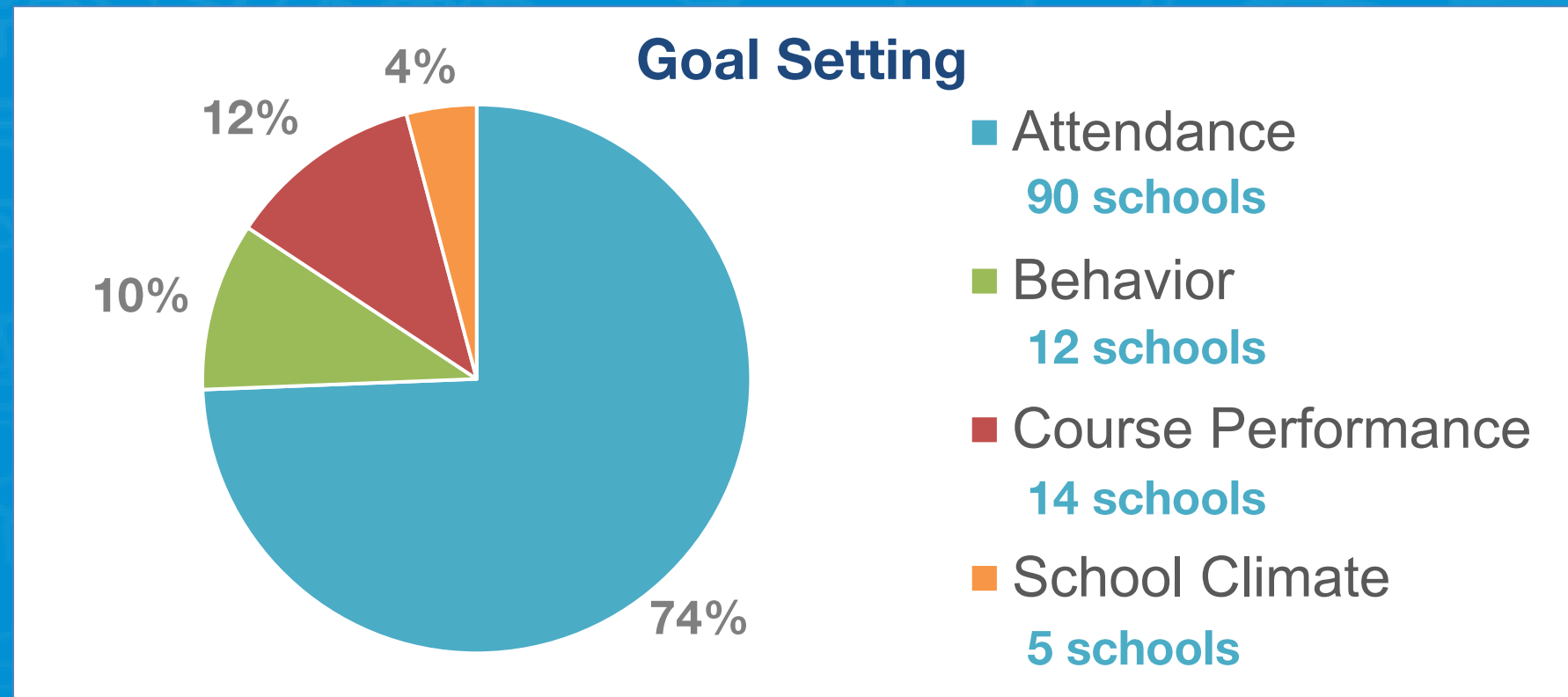
- State Public Charter Authority is now the 2nd largest district in Nevada (behind Clark, ahead of Washoe).
 - Statewide school enrollment shrank by over 9,000 students in the last year.
- Despite enrollment numbers shrinking, our caseload still grows, adding on average over 1,100 students year over year for the last 4 years.

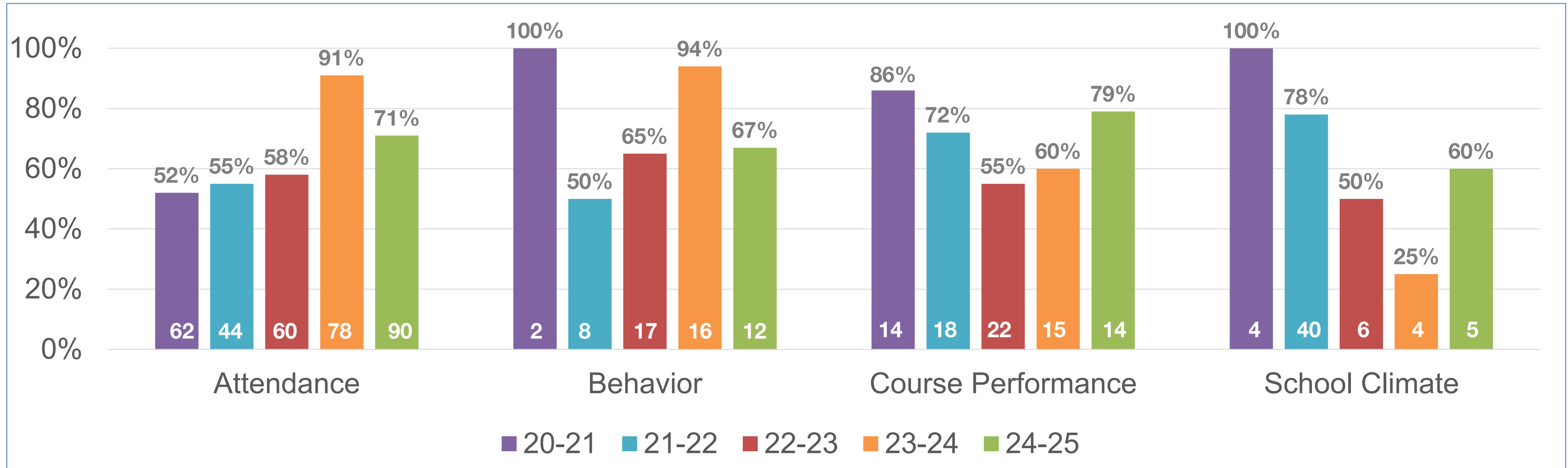


Trend Analysis

- **Emphasis on Attendance goals for schools across the state.**
- **Increase in performance across Course Performance and School Climate.**
- **Decrease in performance across Attendance and Behavior schools.**



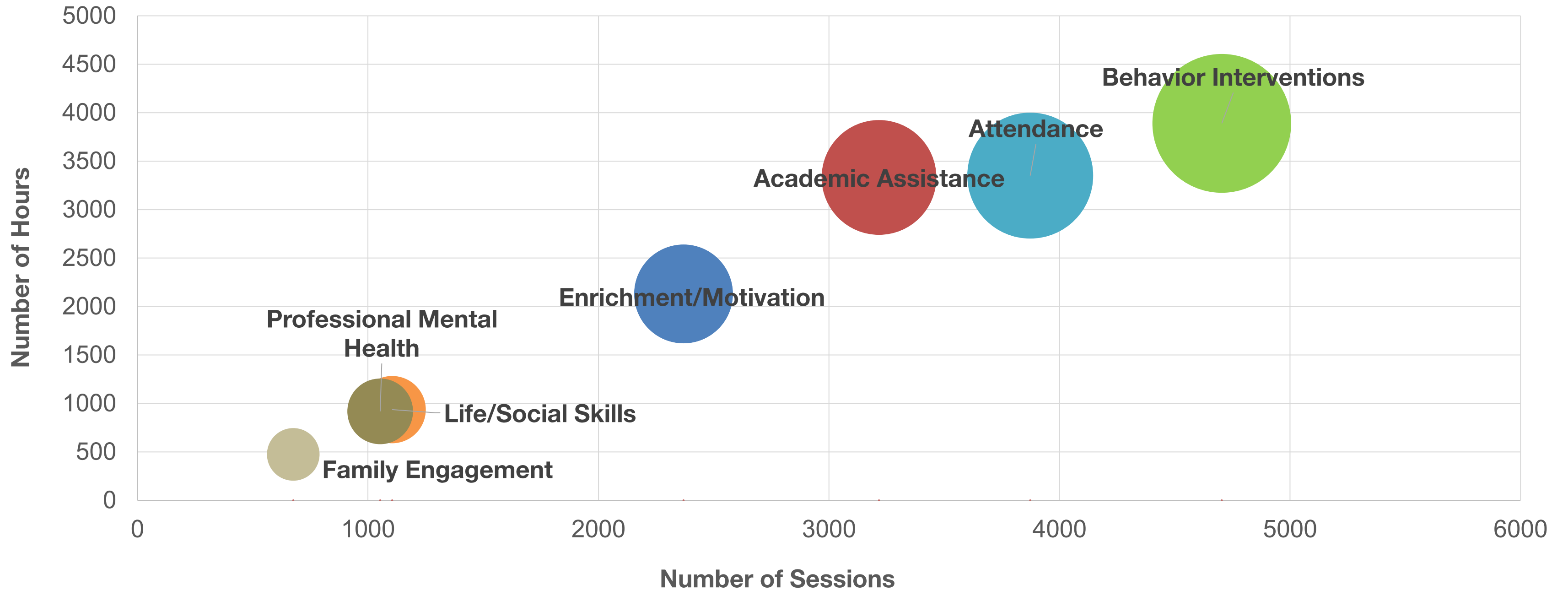
Five-Year Retrospective: Schoolwide Goal Outcomes



- **Course Performance and School Climate** goal areas show **increases** in progress outcomes, 19% and 35% respectively.
- **Attendance and Behavior** goal areas show **decreases** in outcomes, 20% and 27%, respectively.

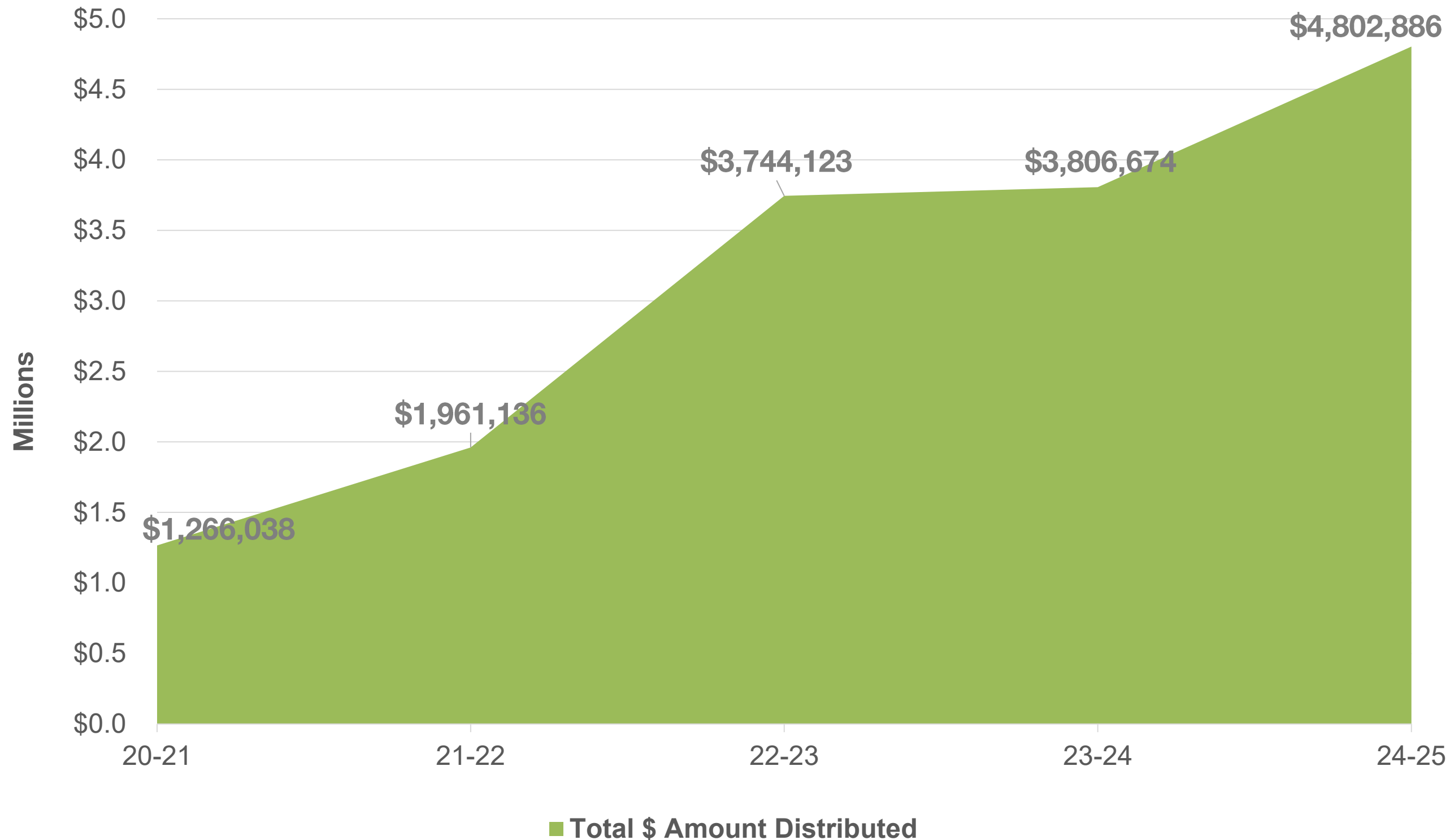
Tier I Supports

Site Coordinators provided a total of 17,296 hours of Tier I (schoolwide) supports to their schools.

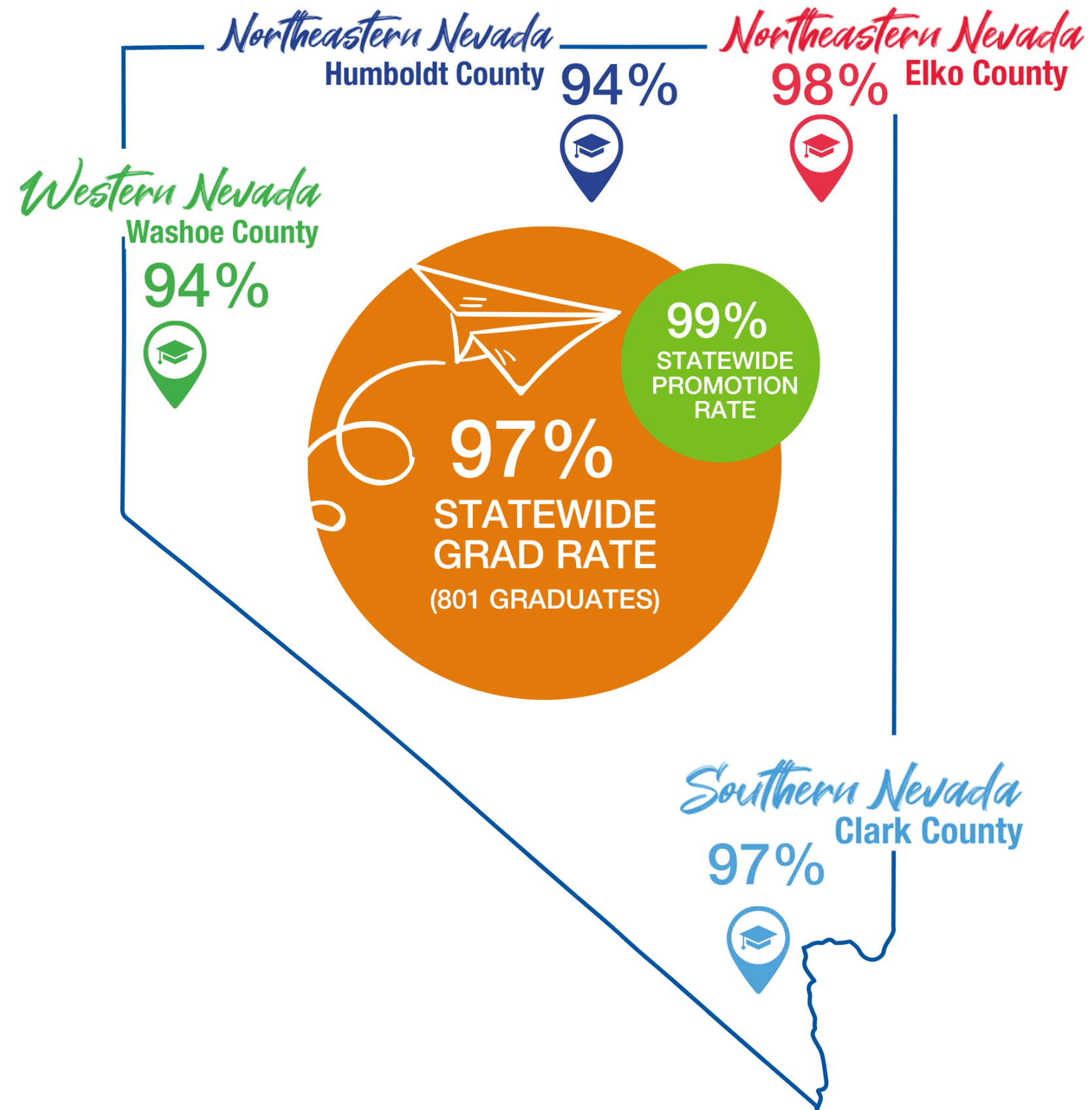
Five-Year Retrospective: Basic Needs Distribution



Trend Analysis

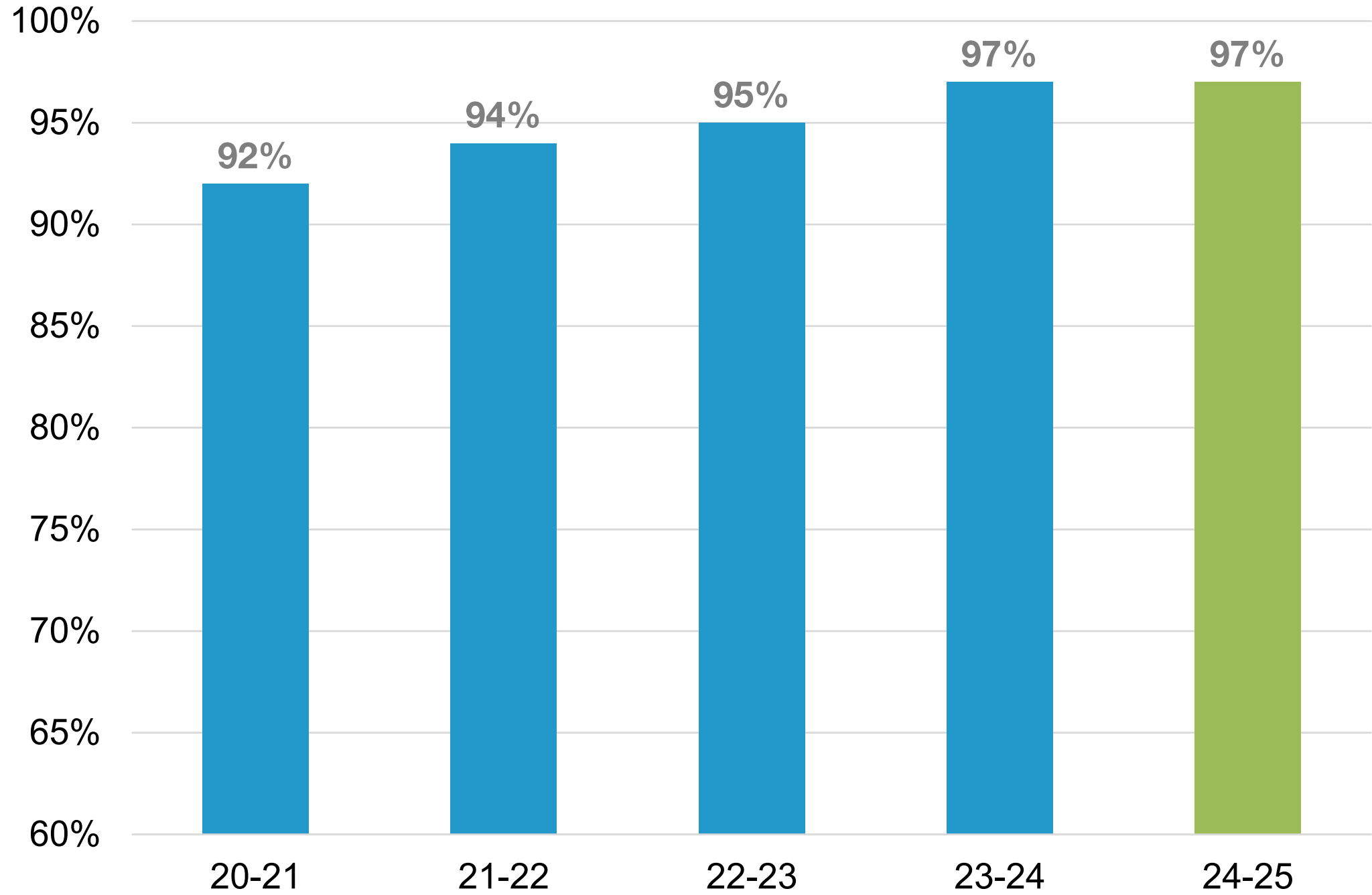
- \$1.27 million distributed in 20-21 to \$4.8 million distributed in 24-25

Five-Year Retrospective: Historical Graduation Rate

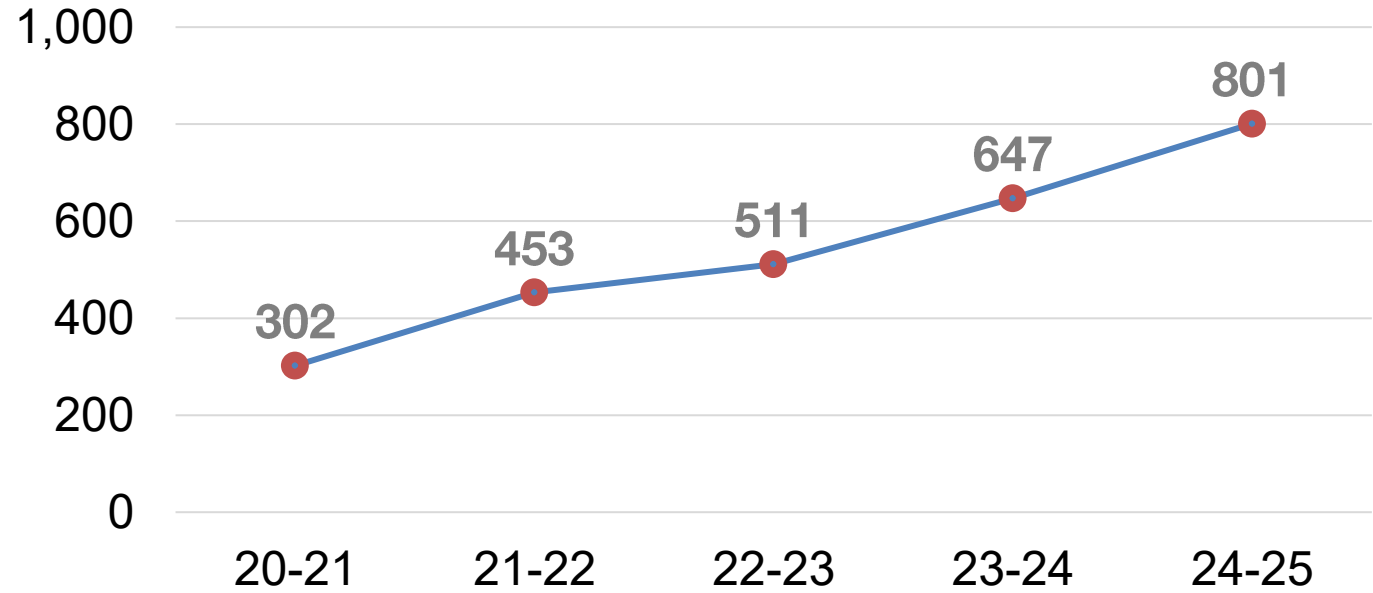
CIS of Nevada Annual Graduation Rate



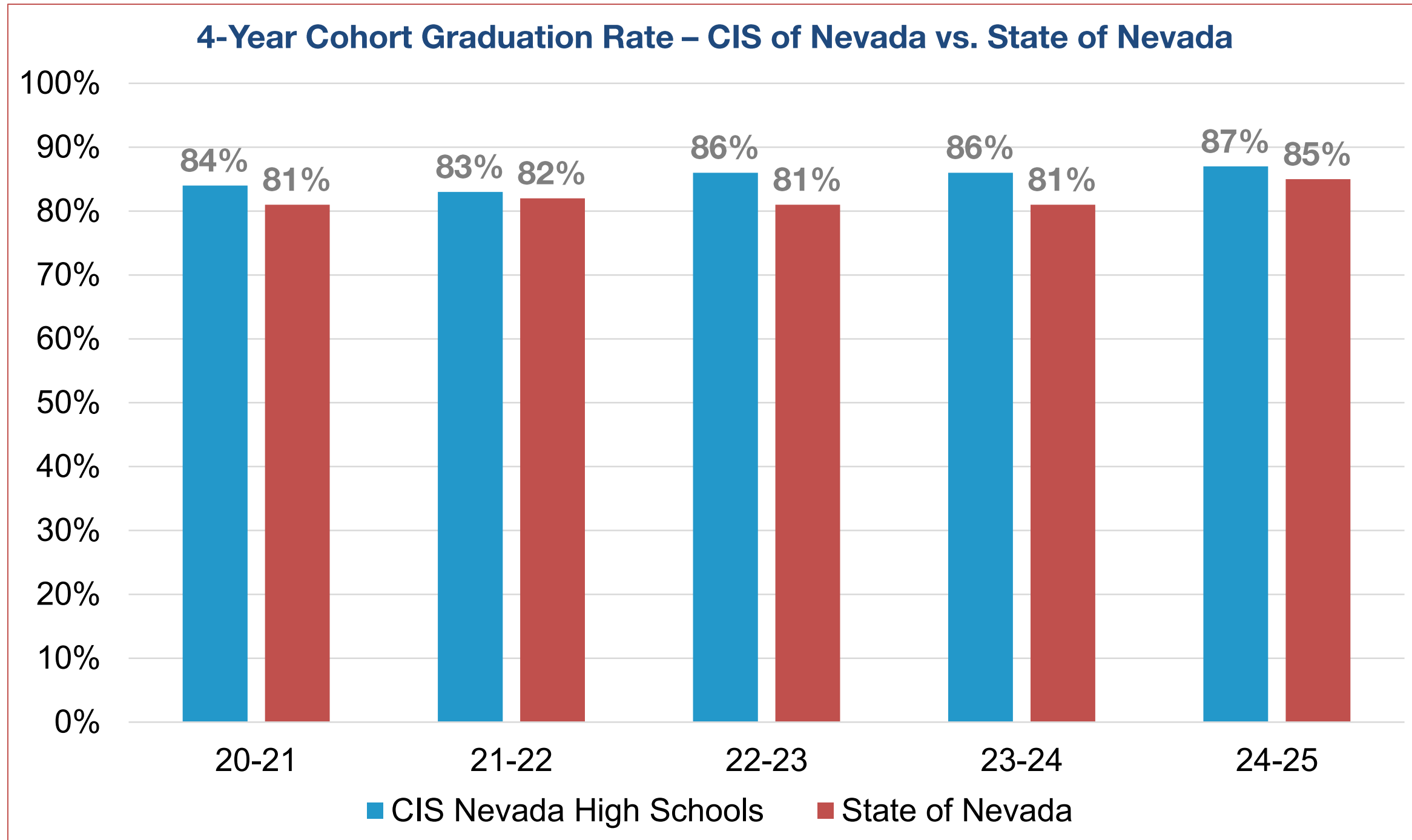
Largest population of graduates in organization history!

***Annual = the % of students that graduated in one year alone (Senior year only)**

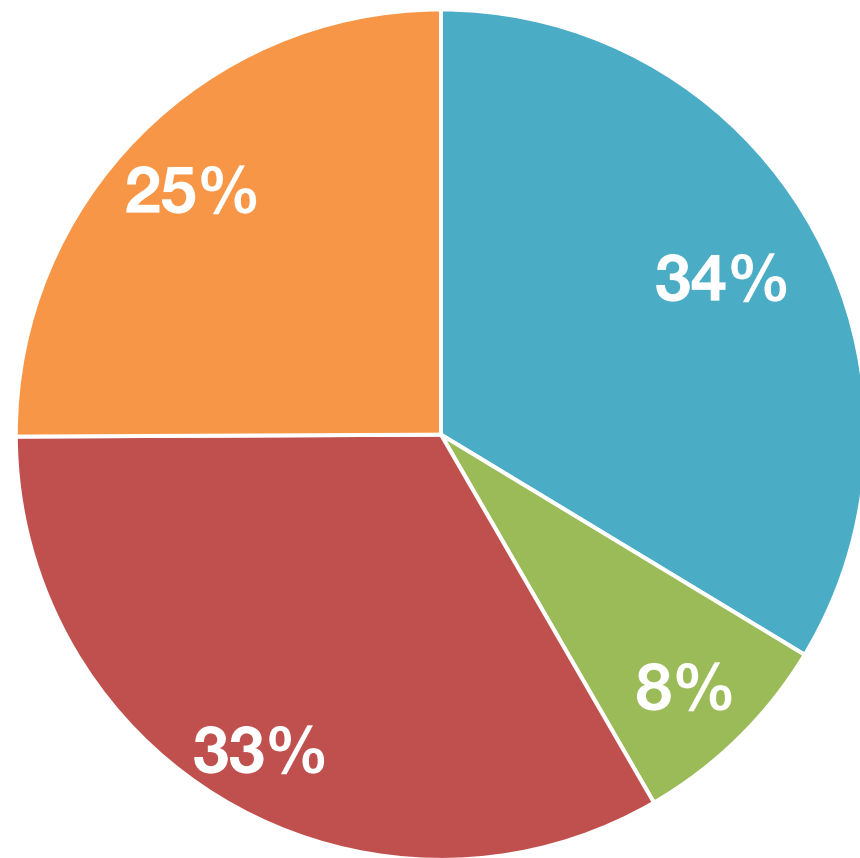
***4-Year Cohort = the % of students that graduated in 4-years. Accounts for all students who entered or exited a class across the 4-year period (Freshman through Senior)**

- We continue to outpace the state average graduation rate, maintaining an average of 87% graduation rate at all CIS High Schools – a record high!**

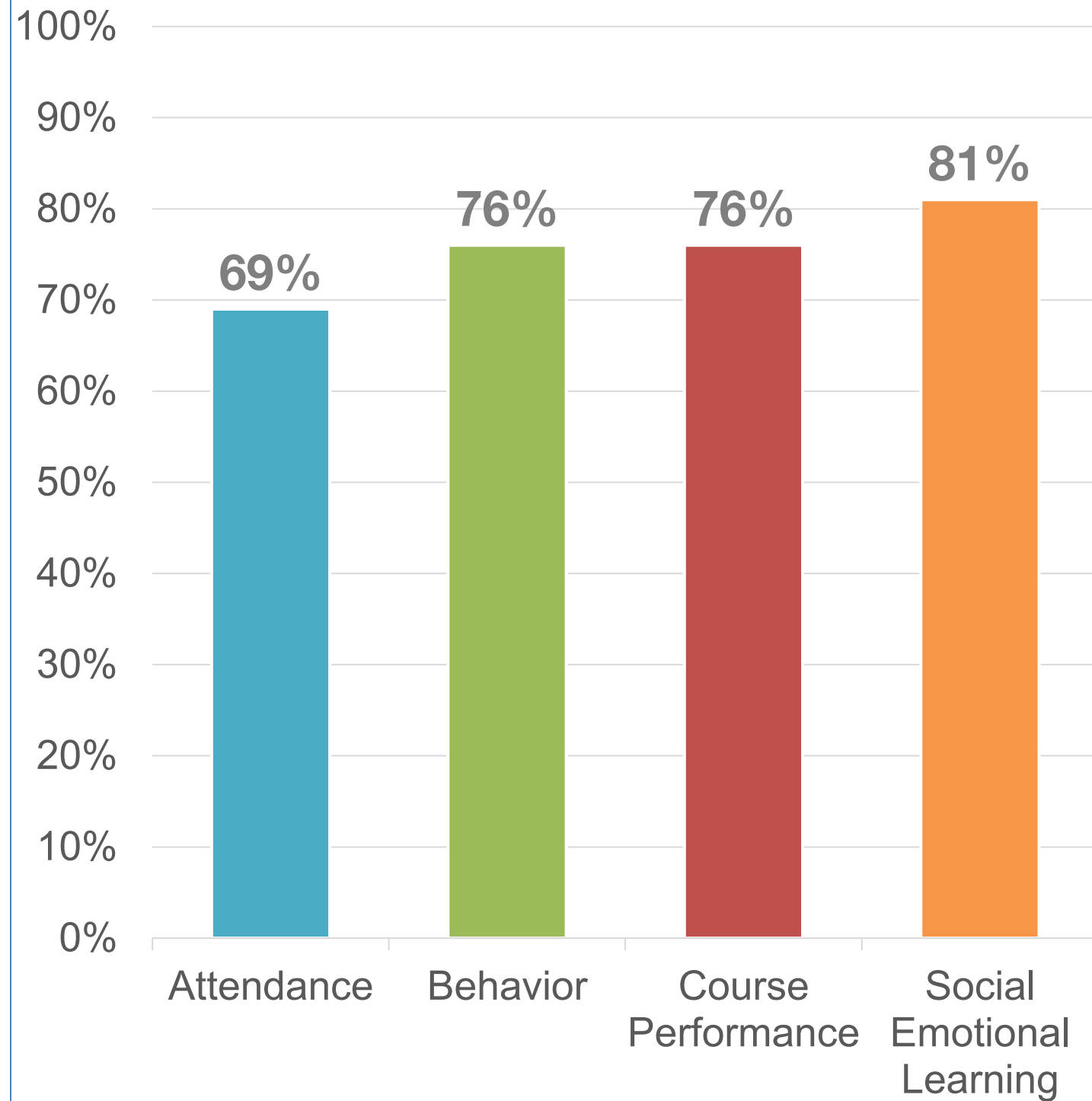

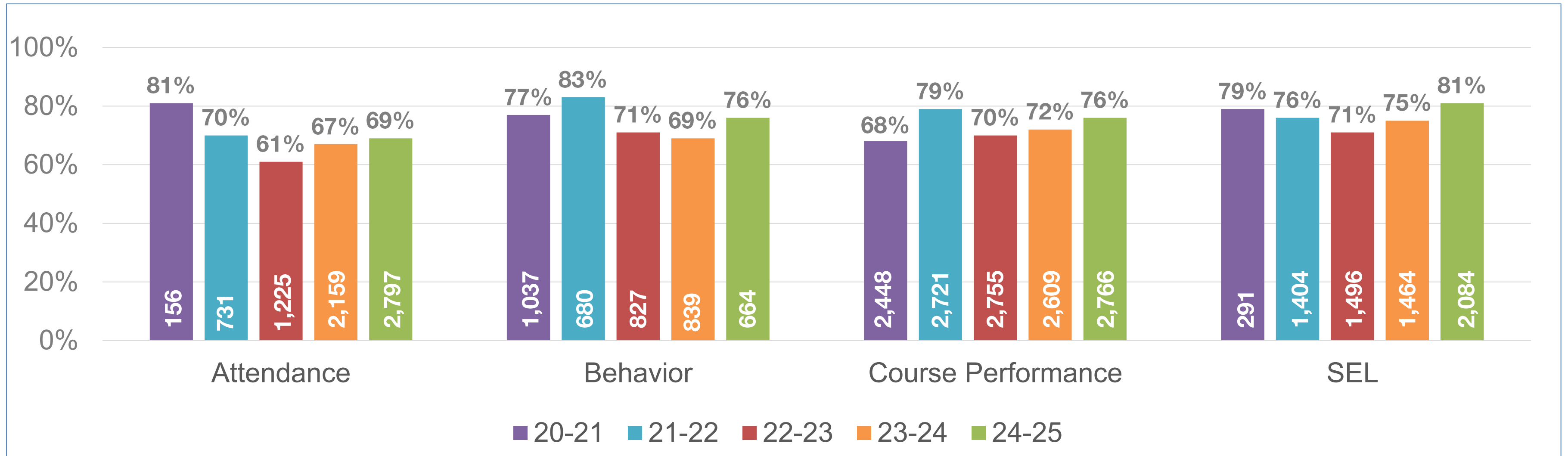
Student Goal Outcomes



Trend Analysis

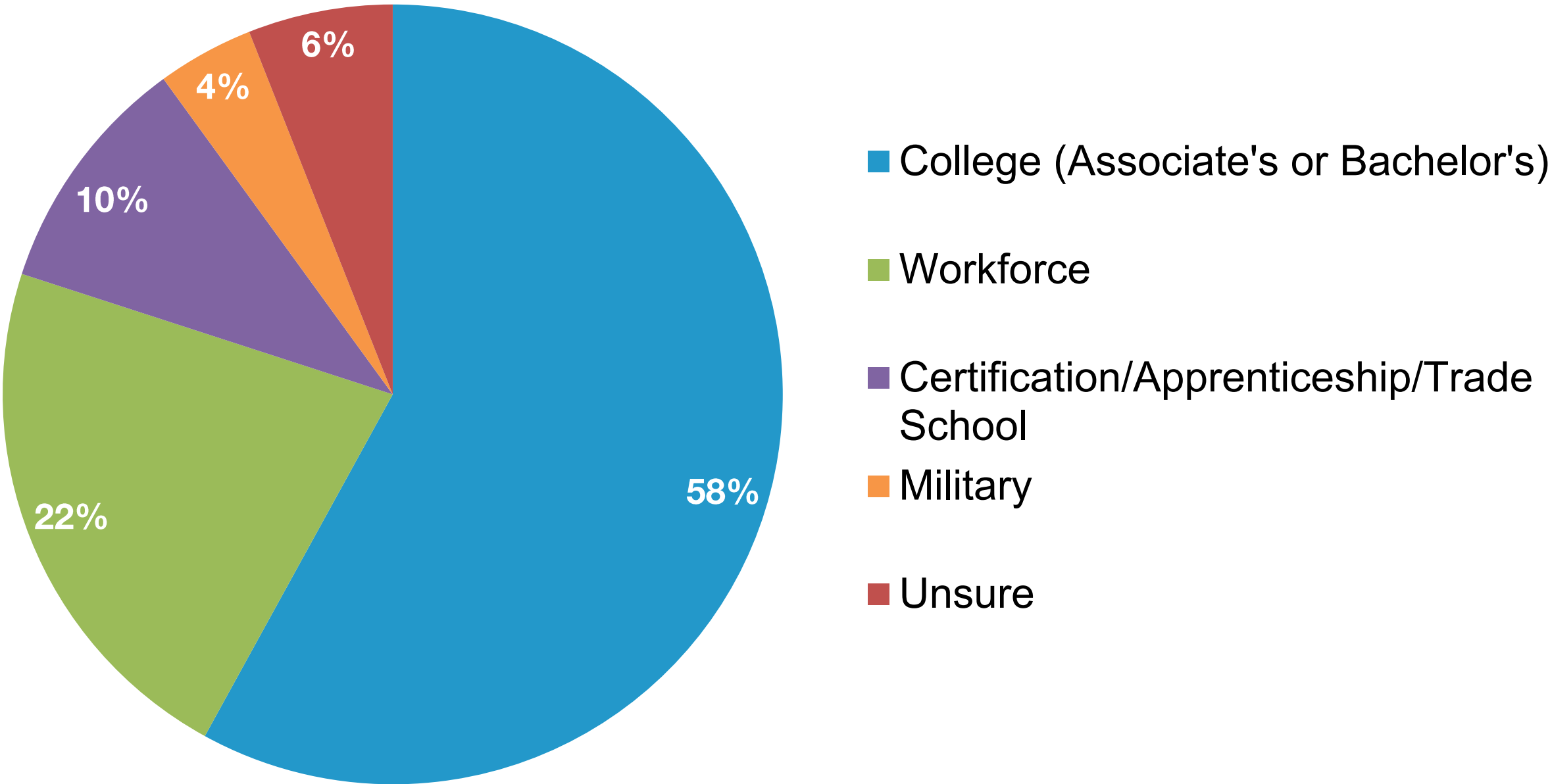
- Attendance goals surpass Course Performance goals in frequency for the first time in organization history.
- Increase in frequency: Attendance, SEL
- Decrease in frequency: Course Performance, Behavior
- Increase in progress across ALL goal areas – an organization first!

Five-Year Retrospective: Student Goal Outcomes



- **2% increase** in Attendance goal outcomes,
- **7% increase** in Behavior goal outcomes,
- **4% increase** in Course Performance goal outcomes
- **6% increase** in SEL goal outcomes.
- **Our caseload continues to grow; we added 1,329 students in the last school year.**

Achieve in Life: Post-Secondary Plans



Trend Analysis

- Most of our graduating, case-managed students plan to attend some amount of college.
- The next most frequent choice is to enter the workforce.
- Career certification, apprenticeships and trade schools are the 3rd most frequent choice for post-graduation, with only 10% of students selecting.
